My Dear Lord,

Aware as I am, from the  
Communications with which your  
Lordship has honored me, of the  
Objections which attach to any  
Application to Parliaments for any  
additional Provision towards defraying  
the Medical Charges; it was not  
without Concern that I felt it to be my  
Duty to solicit the Queen's Authority  
for

for making the accompanying  
Representation. With the same  
feeling I take the liberty of mentioning  
that, in consequence of the excellent  
arrangements made by Mr Stephenson  
under the authority of Lord Winchelsea,  
I have every reason to believe that  
at the Expiration of the Year there  
will be no inconsiderable Surplus,  
after providing for all the Expenses  
to be defrayed by the Annual  
Sum of £100,000 issued for

per the Windsor Establishment. -

I should <sup>not</sup> wish this Circumstance to  
be noticed until Officially reported  
to the Treasury by Lord Winchelsea  
but I venture to mention it thus  
early for your Lordship's private  
Information, in the Event of your  
considering whether any part of the  
Whole of such Surplus could be  
applied in Aid of the Funds which  
have proved inadequate to the  
Discharge of the Medical Expenses.

I am sensible that I am taking  
a very great liberty in offering  
this or any other suggestion to your  
Lordship, but I have full confidence  
in your indulgent consideration of  
the matter.
