

Windsor Aug. 31st 1803.

The King has read with great attention the paper the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland has thought it right to prepare, stating the previous notice on the 16th of the cabals existing at Dublin and Belfast which He had received and the attention He had given to that business from that time to its interruption in the Capital on the night of the 23rd. The King cannot but add that He thinks it clearly shews there has been no want of precaution except in not having some Ammunition more at hand.

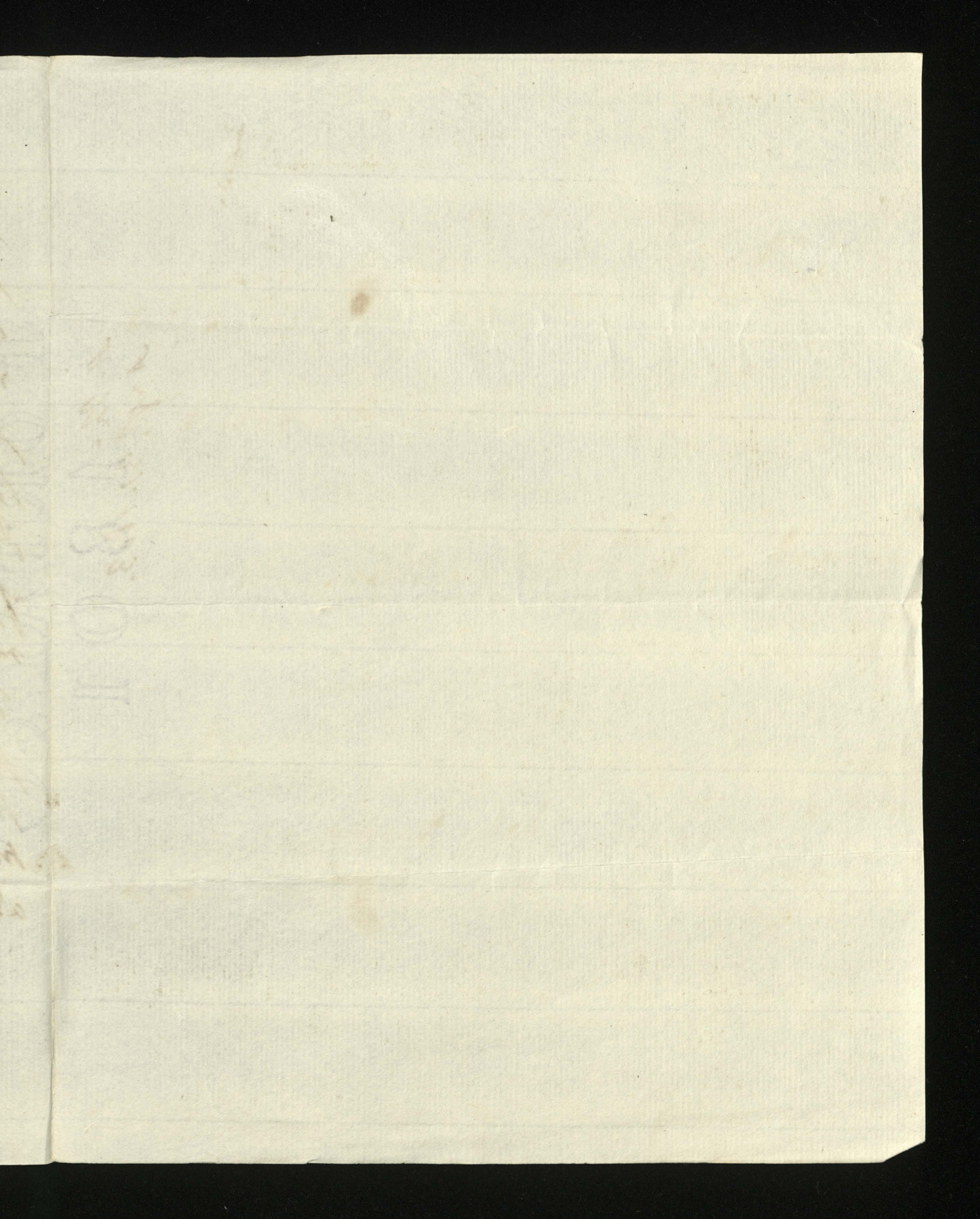
