of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith etc. **SO** All to whom these presents shall come  
 greeting Whereas in Consideration of the Duties Love and Affection which we bear towards the Queen our most  
 dearly beloved Consort and for the better Support of our Royal Family we were graciously pleased to Grant  
 and Allow unto her a Sum of Money or yearly Pension of forty thousand Pounds of Lawful money of  
 Great Britain to be ~~summed~~ payable unto her said Majesty at the Receipt of our Exchequer out of our  
 said Majesty's Revenue **Now** Know ye that we of our especial Grant certain Knowledge and full Power  
 have given and Granted and by these presents do Give and Grant unto our said most dearly beloved  
 Consort Queen that she a yearly Sum of Money or Pension of Ten thousand Pounds of Lawful money of

Great Britain in Addition to our said former Grant of forty thousand Pounds by the Year the same to Commence from the fifth day of July  
 one thousand seven hundred and sixty two and from thence to be payable and paid quarterly by four Eves and equal Particks at the  
 Receipt of our Exchequer at Westminster at the usual Days of Payment in the Year out of any our Revenue or Revenue that shall from time  
 to time be and remain here Applicable to the Use of our said Government the first quarterly Payment of Two thousand five hundred  
 Pounds to be done and paid on the tenth day of October next ensuing **SO** We do Give and Enjoin to our said most dearly  
 beloved Consort the said yearly Sum of Ten thousand Pounds in manner aforesaid during our Royal pleasure **And** we do hereby  
 authorize Require and Command the Commissioners of our Treasury or any three or more of them and our Right Treasurer Chancellor  
 and Under Treasurer of our Exchequer for the time being that they do Cause the said further yearly Sum of Money or Pension of Ten  
 thousand Pounds to be done and Applied in manner aforesaid to our said most dearly beloved Consort or to her Treasurer for the  
 time being for her Use and that our Letters Patent or the Surrender or Exemplification hereof together with the Acquittance or Acquittances  
 of our said most dearly beloved Consort or her Treasurer withstanding the Receipt or Receipts of any Sum or Sums of money in pursuance of  
 this our Grant shall be Good and sufficient Discharge for the Payment hereof **And** we do hereby Give and Grant that such Payments  
 shall be Allowed a positive Receipte Annual or Annuals of such Officer or Officers Paying the same without any further or other Warrant  
 or Certificate to be had or obtained from us or from our Commissioners of our Treasury or our Right Treasurer for the time being or  
 otherwise howsoever **And** we do hereby further Give and Command that our Commissioners of our Treasury or our Right Treasurer  
 Chancellor and Under Treasurer of our Exchequer now and for the time being and all other our Officers and Ministers to whom it  
 shall or may Appertain shall when and as often as it shall be Demanded by our said most dearly beloved Consort or by her Treasurer do  
 or Cause to be done any Sum or Sums of Money and just Payment of the said yearly Sum of Money or Pension of Ten thousand  
 Pounds or any Arrears thereof either by Issuing of Warrants or Orders or by Levying of Callers of Pro or other Callers or otherwise  
 according to the true Intent and meaning of these presents and during the Continuance of the same **And** lastly we do hereby  
 Grant and Declare that these our Letters Patent or the Surrender or Exemplification hereof shall be Good valid and Effectual in the  
 Law to all intents and Purposes and shall be taken Constructed and Adjudged in all our Courts and elsewhere in the most beneficial  
 Sense for the best Advantage of our said most dearly beloved Consort according to our Royal Intention and meaning therein  
 before Express'd Notwithstanding any Omision Imperfection Defect matter Cause or thing whatsoever to the contrary hereof in any  
 wise Notwithstanding **IN** WITNESS whereof we have caused these our Letters to be made Patent **Witness** our self at Westminster  
 the thirteenth day of September in the second Year of our said Majesty
