Whereas the Safety of Our Kingdom of Ireland does much Depend upon a Usefull & proper Train of Artillery with able Officers and Artificers to attend the same We do therefore think fit and accordingly require the Chief Governour or Governours of Ireland for the time being to Inquire into the Ability and Condition of the present Superiour & Inferiour Officers of Our Ordnance and Train to the End that such as shall be found either Unqualified for their respective Employments, or do not constantly reside & Execute the same be removed from such Employment and others fittly qualified placed therein, And that for the future no Inferiour Officers or Artificers belonging to the Ordnance or Train shall be admitted to Serve therein before they shall be approved off by the Said Chief Governour or Governours of that Kingdom And for the further Improvement of the Said Office of Ordnance We do hereby Impower the said Chief Governour or Governours of that Kingdom to Consider and Adjust with the Master of Our Ordnance these such Rules and Orders for the Government and Management of the said Office & Train as shall be deemed most Usefull for Our Service, Which Rules and Orders shall be sufficient Authority to Our said Master of Ordnance and the officers under him to Act by.
