 papers signed.

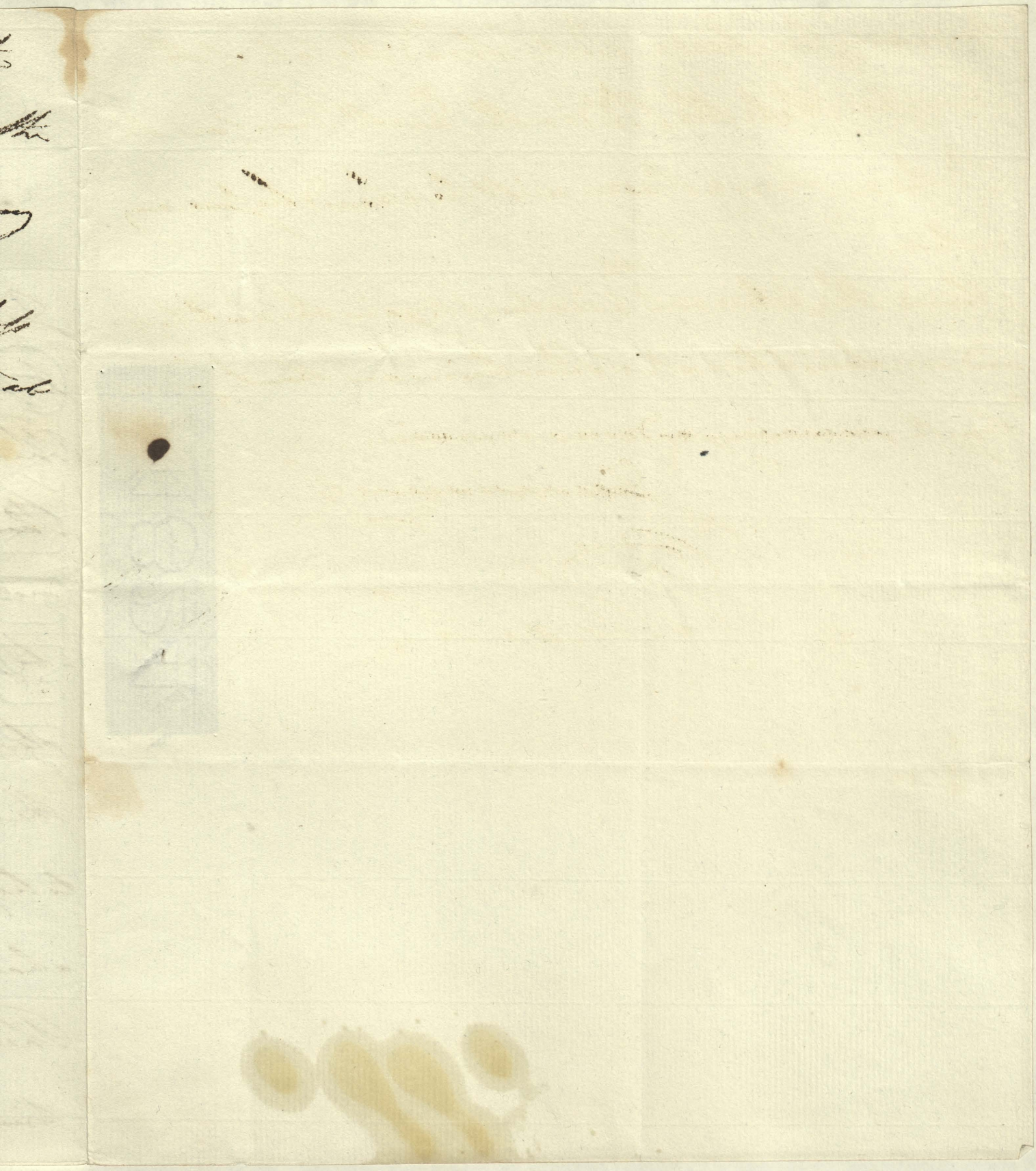
The weather has been most peculiarly fine for the
