This morning I brought me Green
 No. 10 and its various enclosures: I return the encla-
 -ture to the Farm and Gardens signed and have not re-
 -ceived the Park much by agreement: I have also writ-
 -ten a letter of facts to General Hulse which will
 assist Elphinstone and I have my support of him: I have
 every reason to be satisfied with him and therefore ex-
 -pect that you will not "create" ["] except desiring the
 " enclosures being laid up for hay to keep the Farm
stock within his Farm enclosures: indeed as the
courses in Milk are to be sold this season and the re-
 -maining courses and Heifers as they calve down are
 to be sold in the spring I should conceive the Park

except for the sheep could be wanted in future:
 I wish also to know whether (rates and redress
 the number of best horses of the Threshing Ma-
 -chine is entirely given up: but I mean the same
 quantity of land to continue under the Plough:
 I will enquire also whether this is the second time I have
not received that which I much expected and
 remain,
