This morning I went to one Green  
St 10 and it was very cold & wet. I went on the Turnpike -  
- to the Farm and Garden sign and have not re-  
-ceived the Park weekly account. I have also rec'd.  
- a letter effects to general Halloway which will  
- assist Elphick and I have my respects off him. I have  
- every reason to be satisfied with him and therefore ap-  
--prove that you desire Carter <sup>"</sup> ~~in~~ <sup>"</sup> ~~desiring the~~  
~~enclosed~~ <sup>"</sup> ~~being laid up for~~ <sup>"</sup> ~~desiring the~~  
- stock within his Farm enclosed: indeed as the  
- cows in Milk are to be sold this season and the re-  
-maining Cows and Heifers as they call down are  
- to be sold in the spring. Should you in the Park

except for the sheep and not he would infest me.  
I wish also to know whether oats and barley  
the number of bushels of the Threshing the  
shear is entirely given up: but I mean this same  
quantity of grain to continue under the plough:  
I will more observe this in the heat time. There  
are to remain 10 bushels in each granary and we  
remain,
