Dear Daniell,

Yours of 29 came this morning
and I trust the disease is stopped: I approve alto-
gether of the measures you have taken relative to
the horses: it is possible that both the Farmer and
Park Keeper may be right: thirty horses were con-
sidered enough and there were forty six: it might
have been better to have moved the horses often
and this year the folden and straw are short:
for the care of the farm it is probably necessary to have
the deers which has been done every year: the Park
Keeper and Farmer ought to combine together and con-
sider the interest and character of their master: it
may be necessary before the next harvest to make

proper regulations: but the Park-keeper must
 take the horses and the money: no accident has ever
 yet occurred till I have been absent and Colchester
 and Coates must not quarrel to enquire my excuse:
 you have my full authority to read this to them
 separately or together:
