Dear Sir,

The Postoffice taking

my best compliments that having my name  
in a broadsheet cannot find time to write to  
Lord Combermere respecting his resolution in India  
rel. to killing my cattle home, he does not know  
the various interruptions and the immense num-  
ber of letters I must have to answer which tally  
presently my attending to the course of affairs.  
I have another much stronger reason for taking up  
my pen which is to state the yesterday brought me  
letters of Dr. & Mr. Attwells and another from Mr. M. H. Mor-  
ing from Frankfort still the Thails of Lord Sinstone

despatching so that I have not any thing fresh from  
you. That is to begin the day after I left Bury  
the alterations in the Carpenter's Shop and the you  
most willingly from me of the Landes and Party  
being in hand. The four outside of the House might  
be painted for I think for many years ago I  
should never alread painted remaining in England.  
The alterations in the Despatch Room to the King  
and the Cambridge Room may or may not be done.  
But the Whitehall Office are the principal thing  
for this season. You must be least twice a week go  
over regularly the Farmers and Gardeners. Consider and  
the apartments at St. James's are shortly to be let  
you: you will therefore take care to have in pos-  
session the furniture that belongs to me the more  
as it has been by me engaged from them to Bury.

I have not answered it I had intended to write  
it because I have all letters unanswered & Frankfort  
before my return may have much to relate.
