Dear Sir,

I should have had your letter yesterday evening after the post - news you sent - I received its various enclosures of the instant arrival which being at length all safe completed. I have returned signed the proper papers.

As I am not desirous of interfering in to any correspondence with Mr. Halliday particularly as I have given Boston positive directions to keep in England you will tell him I approve of the steps he has taken respecting Jemmett's removal if he merits his punishment I am always advanced this Mr. Harlow & Taylor. I will not give any more

money and his outfit for India must cost five
hundred pounds. I have caught the flight in part
since I left Bombay and will not have been on
the continent.

I suppose this is nearly the last visit Sophia will
pay you before our return. I certainly mean to be
back unless prevented by something extraordinary.
-as near then the first ten days of September.
