Dear Sir,
 At last this day's post has brought me
 yours of the 1th and 10th July from Beesby and their various
 enclosures. I return you for signed the usual papers.
 I shall of course keep the amount of Hay of this year
 and look it over with Elphick. I am glad the hay has been
 got in so well and the quality will make up for the quan-
 tity.

I suppose a large quantity of your having given the Bir. Guinea
 for the driving the Pond in the Nick. These requests
 will you steadily and make up for lost time. I presume
 by the Gardener's statement you have the same fine hot
 weather we have. You are right to think about the tools

and Elphick will drive them of course. The Dutchess
when she knows the circumstances will be as much pleas-
ed as myself that Colonel Sheppard has got into the
Hospital.

I am now satisfied by their being of my return and desire the
-refore all persons and things are in perfect order at
Beechey House on Saturday 3rd September on which
day house keeping is to be resumed and Lady Auguste
with her family having full permission to remain
there from that day. You will write to this effect to
Candrick to whom I enclose a letter. You will direct
Hade if he has not already to change the residence in
the Upper Lodge in which were George's children she
and to have the same suspended until I shall have had of
time. Augusta Sophia has been at Beechey. George is here

with me and returns shortly to England but to again
with Prudnick to join me at Colberg: they return
