it is a very troublesome business, espe-
cially to transfer the Horse into Germany
I therefore think at least for the present
you had better give up all thoughts of
this scheme - I will endeavor to
send a parcel if I can by yr. Messenger

but I will not think of sending one unless
I can get a remarkable beauty or one
I must write to Frederick, & if I have
time to Grenville, Badi, & Merrick, I
am infinitely obliged to you for the
little ribbon you was so good as
to send me. I have ordered it to be
set round. I am so glad that I
