by the Clerk of the Peace
at the expense of the County.
Printed lists to be
ready for delivery on
payment of sixpence
each, on the 1st of
December in each year.
The said list to be a
roll of the electors for the
ensuing year, & no person
to vote whose name shall
not appear on it.

Under Sheriff to be allowed three guineas a day for travelling expenses. The account to be brought before the Justices at Quarter Sessions & when approved, to be paid out of the County Rate.

Heavy penalties on Under Sheriff for partial or corrupt conduct. Penalties on Constables, Churchwardens & Overseers, for any breach of these enactments.

33.

A list of Hundreds, or Districts, in each County to be prepared by Justices at Quarter Sessions, with a plan of polling to each, in such manner that no voter may have more than fifteen miles

miles to travel from his
place of abode to the
place of polling.

Provided that the number
of polling places do
not exceed 15 in
each County. Such
division to be made
at the first Quarter
Sessions after the passing
of this Act or at a
Special Sessions to be
held for that purpose.

34. A list of such
districts, with the towns,
& villages lying in each
& the polling place, to
be lodged with the Clerk
of the Peace. List not
to be altered for

35 Where a County by this
Act is divided into two
divisions, the High Sheriff
of the County, shall fix

35. If on the day of Election
more Candidates are
named than there are
vacancies & a poll is
demanded, the High
Sheriff shall fix the
Poll to take place on
the next day but one
in the usual divisions
and shall adjourn
the County Court till
the sixth day at noon,
not including Sunday.

37. The Booths to be
erected by contract
with the Candidates.
If they do not agree,
by the Sheriff at the
expense of the Candidates.
Poll Clerks to be paid
one guinea a day by
each Candidate.

38. The poll to last
on

on the first day seven
hours, and on the
second day eight hours,
& to close on the second
day at four o'clock.
The Poll Clerks to go
with their books to
the Sheriffs, who shall
declare the return on
the sixth day from the
adjournment of the Court,
& the fourth from the
commencement of the
poll, Sundays not included.

29. The Act relating to
