I have not the slightest selfish feeling in view I neither look for money nor title - I wish only to save my King God bless him

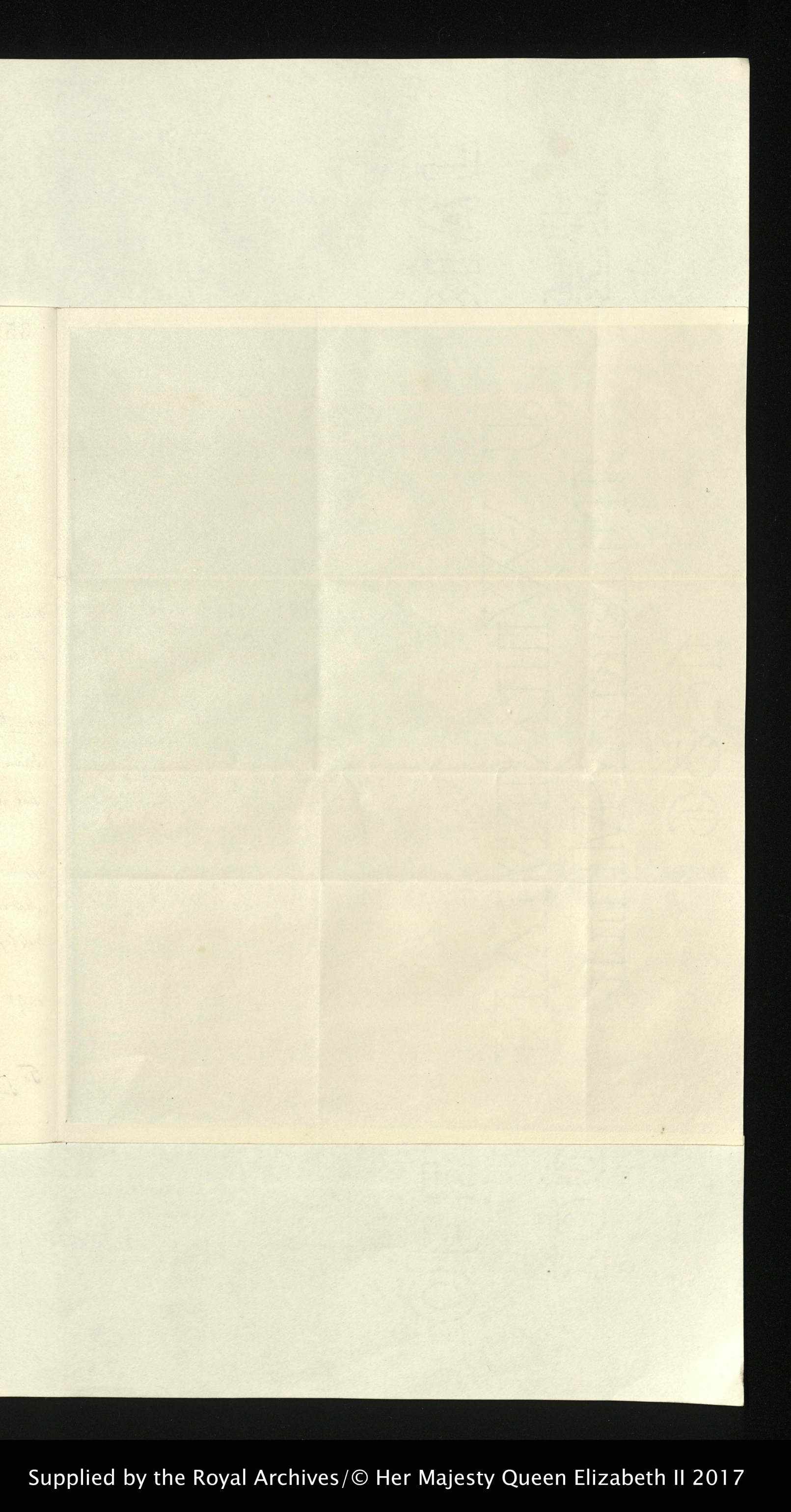
