My dearest Son. The King being now Informed of every
thing relatif to Public Business, there still remains one
Point to be brove to Him. Namely poor Amelia's Will.
The Ignorance of which may lead to very Unpleasant
Conversations should He see His Family before that is done.
But as the ^{Pro} Chancellors coming down to Windsor
solely for that purpose might distress the King if His
Mind was not prepared for it, would You & Mr Brothers
Adolphus have any objection to Mr Henry Holford
preparing Him for it, as a Man in whom the King
has put great Confidence, & who would be able to answer
more Satisfactorily any Questions which naturally
must arise upon the Subject, as He was so well acquaint-
ed with the State of Her Mind. The sooner this
Unpleasant Business is over, the better, as it is likely
to forward a meeting between the King & His Family
& prevent many Distressing altercations.

L^d H. H. is in Town untill to Morrow Afternoon, &
any orders You have for Him, He of course will obey
so that after Thursday I trust no more obstructions
between a meeting of the Family by degrees with the V^{ty}
can arise
