Sir,

Many times since I last arrived in England, I have been on the point of soliciting a favour of Your Majesty, and hitherto I have always been afraid of taking up the time employed by Your Majesty in affairs of moment, but being emboldened by the consciousness of my innocence, I am induced by gratitude & now presume hardly to impinge upon Your Majesty that the obligation I am under to Captain Richard Godwin Heath, who has the honour of being a Master and Commander, makes me solicit some mark of appro-

lation from Your Majesty towards him: when I first had the  
honour of entering into the naval service, Admiral Digby  
made Captain Thats the Lieutenant give me the first practi-  
cal sediments in my profession, and as he advanced in the  
Prince George to have the charge of a watch, the Admiral with  
the entire approbation of Mr. Payndie placed me in his  
watch on board. I was with this officer from the 1<sup>st</sup> of June 1779 by  
to the end of November 1781 when the Admirals Flag was  
shifted on board the Lion: Captain Thats was removed into  
this ship with Payndies concurrence, and, during the com-  
ing winter I was on shore at New York, he used to go  
about with me in his boat it was inconvenient for the Admiral to  
be of the party: during this winter Mr. Digby at my request  
promoted him to warrant he now enjoys in the Royal Navy.

At the time Your Majesty thought proper to remove me from Adm'ral Digby to command Lord Hood, and was graciously pleased to give Mr. Mayindie his choice either of returning home or of remaining with me abroad and in case Mayindie returned, a sea officer was to be appointed by either of these Admirals with his concurrence, Captain Treat was named by Mayindie and myself. They have to refer Your Majesty for the above particulars to Mayindie who will be confident concerning what I now have the honour of relating.

In the case of Captain Treat Adm'ral Digby without the concurrence of Lord Hood sent Captain Phipps, and Your Majesty has no thorough or exact collection of what their Maj's did that I need not mention it, and I may with the greatest truth affirm that had Captain Treat been the

Officer, and every thing would have gone on as it ought, in which  
case my worthy friend Captain Heath would have had the  
honour of being personally known by Your Majesty, and some  
quarterly five years ago promoted instead of which he is  
still a Master and Commander. Through Admiral Digby or  
my quitting here first gives me his leave to promote him as  
though he was the person who had the first charge of me  
a sea officer. Upon my being ordered out with Admiral with  
Linenon I requested as a favour Captain Heath would accom-  
pany me. He is now on board the Indomitable, and has  
been during the course of infinite service to me. After having  
thus laid the circumstances before Your Majesty of the case  
of this deserving and unfortunate officer. I most humble and

There is no impropriety in my request that he may be promoted  
to the rank of Post Captain: in order that Your. Majority  
may be convinced that I have not the most distant idea of  
asking for another favour of this sort, I solemnly declare  
there is no officer in the service to whom I can by any means  
indeed accept Captain Heath: should Your. Majority be  
gracious enough at my request to promote this affair,  
I shall fulfil it as a most sensible favour towards my party,  
and as a circumstance to be forgotten. I much in-  
-deed prize it but least, that whenever Your. Majority intend  
to confer a favour on me, this will be the greatest.

(On the instant I joined the Admiral

off the Start: he immediately proceeded to the Westward, and during the first week of his voyage made the most of the fine weather by causing the squadrons with different evolution
