THE PRINCE OF WALES, THE DUKE OF YORK, AND
DUKE OF CLARENCE.

THE FIRST NUMBER will appear on the 29th of September next, and will contain a correct Copy of a POST-OBIT BOND, granted by their Royal Highnesses to JOHN CATER, of Beckingham, in the County of Kent, Esq. dated the 16th December, 1788; also a Bond granted by them to ABRAHAM and SIMON BOAS, of the Hague, Bankers; dated the 30th November, 1789; under the Direction of ABRAHAM GOLDSMID, of London, Esq. together with another Bond, given by them to JOHN JAMES DE BEAUNE, of Union Court, Broad Street, in the City of London, bearing date the 5th of June, 1790; and by him negotiated in Paris, who with his Colleagues were tried thereon, and Guillotined, on the 14th of February, 1793, upon the prosecution of Mr. PERREGAUX, Banker, and Member of the Revolutionary Tribunal, and the British Secretary of Legation, whose Language on that Trial is cautiously and accurately given.

THE SECOND AND THIRD NUMBERS of this Work will be published on the 29th Days of October and November following, wherein will be introduced the remaining Joint-Securities issued by their Royal Highnesses since the Year 1787; together with relevant Anecdotes, particularly that upon the Distribution of the Dutch Loan, and the Manner whereby Mr. GOLDSMID was FINESSED out of his Commission.

Without Reserve to Rank or Profession, much interesting Matter will be developed in these Numbers, wherein will be detailed an Account of the Duke of Portland's banishing CHARLES HENRY VOUCHER, and several other of the PRINCE'S FOREIGN CREDITORS out of England without hearing, under the Sanction of the Alien Act, and what befel them afterwards upon the Continent.
