Dear Brother,

The newspapers this week have surprised me indeed by talking of the Riding House and signing a long Commission: but this afternoon upon my return from the course, I find enquiries after tomorrow were at St. James's: all this is very different to what was the case when I left the town and what the Duke of York told me on Thursday that I cannot understand the business: indeed many may see like me were in doubt: yet I believe no one has seen the King & at least none of this man's family: I shall be very anxious to know whether

we shall have seen some of his relations.

The invasion is considered certain by Friends at least the words of the Valentine indicate their idea; invasion and the state of parties in this country will not make matters more quiet. or even
at the Lewis' House: it cannot last so long there
at present. I am and must be stationary here for
the exercise. but shall be always ready and happy
to attend you when wanted: in the mean time
advise and never believe me.
