of their Father, had he survived the late Lord of

after Sir James Grant. -

May I hope that your Royal Highness will do
me the honor, so to mention the subject to the
Prime Minister, that, His Royal Highness may
understand that, the request is made more particularly
on account of the Miss Grants, who as near concerns
of my own, I feel much interested for, & whose situation
I conceive is such, as to preclude their ever applying
to government for the means of supporting their
