Dear Sir,

I have little or nothing
to say as I have literally since last Sunday been waiting
for the ship to carry me home yet I take up my pen
this is the first day. I think the official account and
all the reports are good and successful and what
gives me the greatest pleasure is the horror all sorts
of people and nations have of seeing the peace signed
with Bonaparte. I hope this is the last letter I shall
be able to write to you on the Continent. but I shall

since you are this time if I am still here on the next
last day. The grand Dutch ship is expected here next
Sunday and has only thirty attendants. The Prince
should stay returns today to dinner. The moment I
reach English ground I will give you word. Adieu till
we meet and ever believe me,
