Dear Mr,

I have this morning received my or-

-ders to sail and shall without fail tomorrow the
moment the Port is in: I see and believe every thing
and person that must be moved from the Fort into
the Impugnabile will be on board by sunset: I have
had since yesterday morning to make and procure
forty beds, furniture and cots which I expect to
be completed this evening: we have not been idle
and will not move sooner than tomorrow: I am very
anxious to do every thing to reflect credit on the

Prince Regent and to receive the Sovereigns with
respect and magnificence.

Enclose the list of those intended to travel with the
Sovereigns on board this ship and a copy of the
directions I shall issue relative to the Ceremony
intended to use on embarking and landing the Compe-
-nors of Russia and the King of Prussia.

Charles Stewart will send me a King's Messenger
to announce the departure of the Sovereigns from
Paris and also if necessary any alterations in the
lists of those who embark in this ship. I shall of
course write accounts as they and ever remain,
