Dear Mr.

I hope and believe, during your passage  
over to Boulogne and if we have the advantage  
of eight and forty hours remaining there before  
the Sovereigns come on board I shall have every  
thing completed to my mind and such has will do  
honour to the Prince Regent and please and satis-  
-fiesh the Emperor of Russia and the King of  
Prussia. I have taken enough of servants and fur-  
-niture out of the Faculty to do all night and have  
-some here and get left enough on board not to do



discredit to the Jacobins.

I have this moment received a letter from Lord Grenville which rather surprises me and is in a - not contradiction to Charles Stewart's letter and to Lord Castlereagh's: the Ministers do not leave Paris before tomorrow: Paul Bonaparte in an hour's time and hope to have the fleet at an anchor off Dunkirk in the course of the night at latest.

I am much hurried and will write a very - short answer: advise and ever believe me,
