June 28: 1814.

Dear Sir,

owing to the fatigue of the servants
of the Prince Regent and the unavoidable embar-
- on attending a hurried embarkation of people not
used to the sea I could not have written till last
Sunday at noon: the wind was never steady and was
fortunate to reach Dover by ten yesterday morning:
on my arrival there I found the King of Prussia
in the act of embarking on board the *Gyrfalcon*
for Calais where he landed last evening before dark:

Got on board the *Gyrfalcon* just before she made
sail: the King received me most kindly and gave
me the Black Eagle and again persuaded me to visit
Berlin: he has also invited my daughter: Then pro-
-ceeded on shore and was directly sent for by the
Grand Dutchess who had previously by my arrival
determined on embarking at sea on board the *Jason*
for Calcutta: I endeavored to persuade her to go with me
but could not and was therefore prevented by not be-
-ing able to visit my *Flay* on board the *Jason* from
attending the Emperor next to Command the *Frigates*
sailing to much water and the *July* going on

the banks: the wind being fresh. Endeavored to per-
-suade the Emperor to go to Calais but he would
-pursue to Ostend: he took me to dinner and Lord
-Garnault Turner and myself were of the party
-with the Grand Dutchess and a very few Jesuits:
-I attended the Emperor on board the yacht and again
-expressed his going to Calais: he would not hear of any
-thing but Ostend: he was very civil and left him
-at six: then waited on the Grand Dutchess till the
-Emperor got under way and returned to their ship
-four men: sent all the small vessels with the
-Emperor: the moment the Emperor returns from

Calais & shall ship my Play to her and not having con-
sidered the navigation of the Thames as a home
intend proceeding in the forenoon the River and
shall therefore be in London either Thursday or
Friday:

My business for the present is over and I have
executed every thing agreeable to the wishes of my
brother: I have much to say: but we shall meet
so soon that I shall only subscribe myself

P. A. I have just recd. Yours sincerely
- in order to strike
my Play and shall be
in town tomorrow.
