Buckingham Palace.
Nov: 4: 1823.
Late at Night.

brother Captain Adolphus Fitz Clarence
which calls for the most warmest acknow-
ledgment. It was a matter I had most
particular care to attend to and for which I shall

It is impossible but my warmest affectionates
with every due sense of regard and duty feel

esteem this mark of favour and gracious kin-
-ness bestowed on him by your Majesty
and I trust we shall be thenceforward
never worthy of the continuance of your
Majesty's good opinion.
