 -est gratitude to His Majesty for this con-
 -sideration and peculiar goodwill toward me & for
 -mercy to me which I really want words
 to show the feelings of my heart.

Last night I saw Barton who gave me the
 account of what passed between you and him

and I am again to thank you for the kind interest
you have taken in bringing my affairs before
- me the King and also for undertaking with
Barton the arrangements of paying to the best
advantage His Majesty's most gracious and
magnificent bounty and considering my
ways and means and the best method for
-ture proceeding.

I have reason to see either the metallic
or paper currency. I am only anxious to receive
signed by the trades people the receipts for
the variace seems that yourself and Barton
will have given in consequence of the generosi-
-ty of my brother. I will thank God place
me in such comfort that with common sense

...ence I look forward with a certainty to be
able to clear the whole of my shooting debt.
I am more and more convinced that the end will
be in my favor.
