Dear Sir,

When from my anxiety to enquire
 after your Majesty's health, I wrote to Lord
 Liverpool, I mentioned the reason, I did
 not however take up my pen, as because
 I remained I should have at the same time
 been able to send the enclosed statement of
 my present circumstances, thus extending
 your Majesty's relief by the Ten
 Thousand Pounds, I have received from the
 King's Grace. However at length the pay-

minutes have been made and the result is to
one most satisfactory and useful for the many
most and sincere gratitude. On the receipt
of the enclosed paper from Boston I thought
it right to inform the Secretary of the state
of my affairs thus minutely and comfortably
arranged and he desires me to express to your
Majesty our joint and our private expressions
of attachment and regard for this most unexpec-
-ted and valuable mark of your Majesty's
kindness to us both.

I take this opportunity of informing your Ma-
-jesty that as the Secretary cannot this year
enter his apartments at Mr. Jarvis's and the
