Sr: Henry Halliday yesterday gave me better
assurances and I trust either this day or early
tomorrow to receive more extensive & reasonable
accounts of the King.

I can enter into my brother's feelings on the
general state of our internal and external relations,
- which are with pleasure and concern
that the greatest caution is requisite.

Showing the King's great dislike to hearing of

indisposition my life are - I never see to and in -
- did I trust I know where and where discretion
and silence are requisite.
