By Virtue of the Power and Authority to us given. We do hereby constitute  
and appoint you      Admiral of the Red Squadron of His Majesty's Fleet;  
Willing and requiring you forthwith to take upon you the Charge and Command  
of      Admiral of the said Squadron accordingly and to wear the Red Flag at  
the main top-mast-head on board such Ship of His Majesty's belonging to the said  
Squadron as you shall happen at any time to be. Hereby willing and requiring all  
Commanders Captains and other Officers and Companies belonging thereto to be  
obedient from time to time to your Commands as      Admiral of the said  
Squadron. And you likewise to follow such Orders and Directions as you shall  
from time to time receive from us or any other your superior Officer for His Majesty's  
Service. And for so doing this shall be your Warrant Given under our hands  
and the Seal of the Office of Admiralty this 4<sup>th</sup> day of November 1805.  
In the Forty-sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign.
