The King wishes it
might be established by
act of Parliament

1. That his male
Descendants in all cases
and degrees might be
preferred to the Females
in the Succession to the
Crown, notwithstanding
that in order of Blood
the males should happen
to be the more remote.

2. That the Princes
his Descendants who
are not yet born, shall
be incapable of possessing
at the same time the
Kingdom of Great Britain
and His Majesty's present
and future Dominions
in Germany.

3. But if it should
happen that His Majesty's
immediate Successor,
or any of the Descendants
of such Successor, should
have more than one Son,
not born before the
passing this act, the eldest
[of such Sons] shall be

obliged to content
himself with having
the Crown after the
demise of his Father
and with leaving to
his younger Brother
the Electorate, together
with all the Dominions
which the Father was
possessed of in Germany.

4. The Elector
shall notwithstanding
retain his right ~~to~~ of
~~the~~ succession ^{to} of the
Crown, together with
all privileges and
prerogatives annexed
to the said Right, as
well for himself as
for his ^{male} descendants
according to the order
of their Birth, and
with preference to
all Princesses, daughters,
or other females, tho'
in other respects more
nearly related to
the King, to whom
such Elector or his
Descendants happen to
succeed in the order
above-mentioned.

5. and in case such
Elector should succeed
to the Crown, it shall
be lawful for him to
keep the Electorate
also for the term of
his life, but after
his demise the Electorate
shall devolve to his
second son, if he has
more than one, and
~~the~~ ^{his} eldest shall succeed
to the Crown only.

6. But if it should
happen that at his
demise he should leave
but one son, and that
other collateral Princes
of the Royal Family
should be living, the
said son of such
King shall succeed
him in the Crown, and
the nearest of the
male Collaterals according
to the order of Birth,
shall succeed to the
Electorate and Dominions
in Germany.

7. But ^{if} ~~in~~ there
should be no male
collaterals of the
Royal Family living,
in such case the only
Son of the King (as
above described) should
hold the ^{German Dominion} ~~Electorate~~
together with the
Crown, in the same
manner as his father,
until the case specified
in the third article
shall again come to
exist by the King's
having more than one
Son, in which case the
Second Son shall hold
the Electorate and all
the Father's Dominions
in Germany.

8. But if it should
happen that the male
Descendants of the
Electoral Branch should
fail and become extinct,
in such case the nearest
male Descendant of
the Regal Royal Branch should
succeed to the Electorate
and Dominions in Germany.

preferably to the King himself then Reigning, in case such King happen to have more Sons than one, or Brothers or other male Collaterals living. But in default of these, the King himself and his male descendants shall succeed till the case specified in the third article come to exist again.

g. In case of the entire extinction of the male Descendants of His present Majesty, the Crown shall ^{go} ~~pass~~ to the eldest daughter of the King that shall have reigned last.

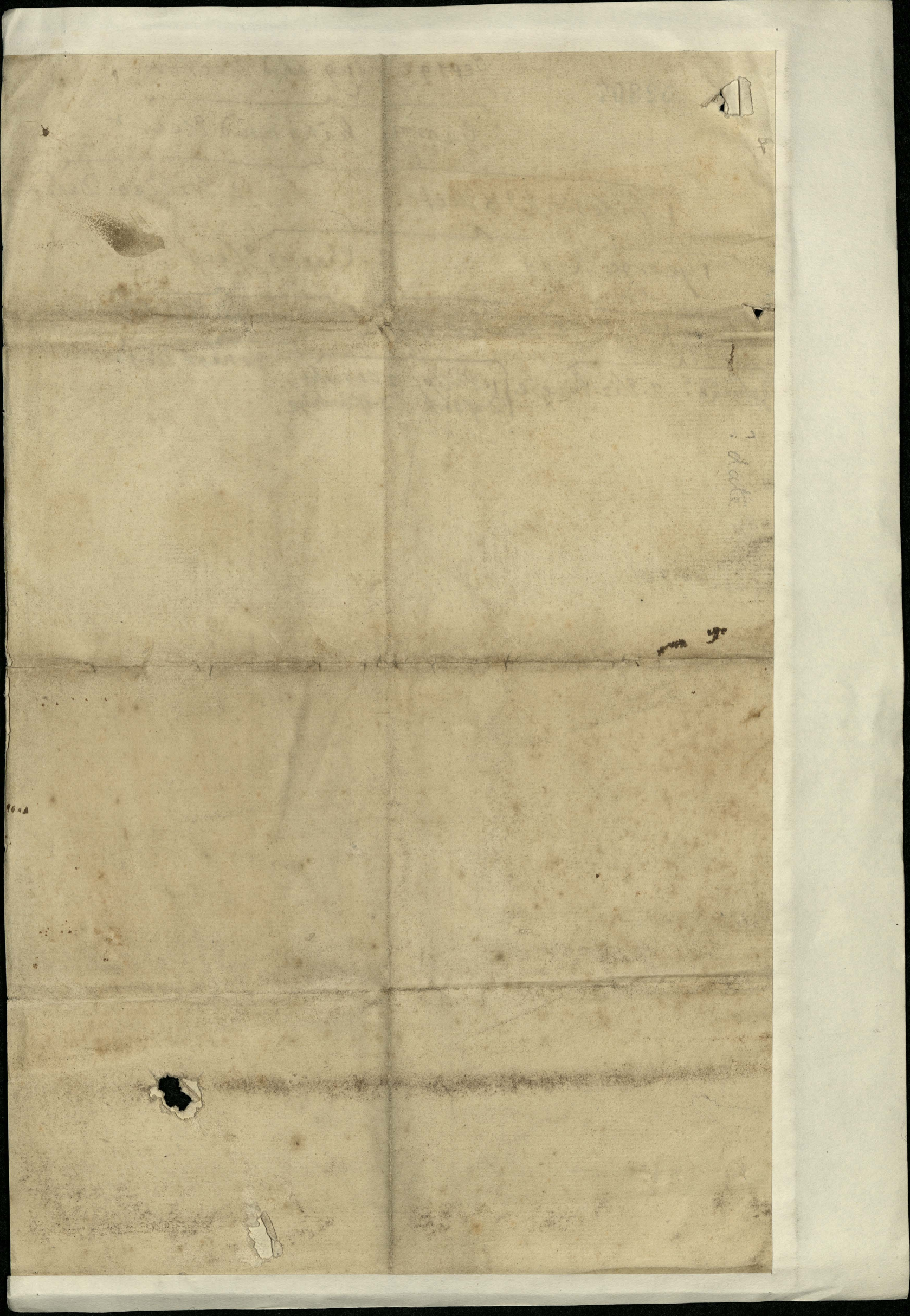
