My Dearest Mary,

I have received both your kind letters and I regret most sincerely that the last does not convey so favourable an account as I had been led to hope for from the contents of the first dated. I grieve to learn that the pain in the Side returned with so much violence & produced so uncomfortable a Night to poor Amelia, but I trust that, upon the whole, Doctor Hope will not find that she has lost ground since he was last at Hingham, and I hope that his personal Attendance may enable him to recommend some effectual means of Relief.
