 Goss left Weymouth early Monday morning
 I am truly sorry to find by your letter

 things owing to Dracks impudence & must
 ever lament any unpardonable treatment
 Brothers you may depend on my staying on
 my guard should he come, but if he does
 I do not think I must be likely to receive the
 insult to me & I should not be surprised
 if his intended, next did not take place
 I hope you are quite well by this time & soon

enjoyed Brighton & the weather was
 been delightful - Mrs. Lyden was taken ill
 yesterday with one of her Complaints in her
 Chest attended with some inflammation
 in consequence she was bled & treated
 she is very much better today therefore
 I trust shortly will be quite well again
 the rest of the family are in perfect

 are here & Mr. & Mrs. Cooks tomorrow
