My dearest Mary

 and your other Medical Attendants. The idea of dear
 Augusta's kindnes in inviting you to her House in London
 delights me and I am sure you will both enjoy the
 spending some days comfortably together. I wish I
 could complete you too and think I might sometimes
 be of a little use though I am a poor Creature.
 Yesterday Evening I gave a little Ball to my
 nephew Prince Alexander of Wurttemberg son to
 Duke Lewis who is settled at Lonsbury for
 two Years to study his Military Duties. The Dance

was unexcused and all my young people much amused
it lasted from six till near half past eleven & continued
both Ball and Supper which is just a good length
of time without allowing any dawdling between the
Dances. After my account of this little amusement
you would not suppose that I could be fatigued, but
a such Headach makes me a very poor Creature
this Morning. However I will not neglect conversing
with you and hope by Monday's Post to be better
able to entertain you. — Miss Throught begs her
Affectionate Respects. I enjoy her Society of all
things and feel very happy at the idea of her
remaining on here till the Spring. Adieu God
bles you. I am happy to think that you will
see Sophy while you are at Augustus and trust
you will find her in good health and Spirits.
