

To Princess Mary

October 24<sup>th</sup> 1809.

Windsor Castle October 24 1809

My Dearest Mary, After the unfavorable Report received yesterday, your kind letter has conveyed me small degree of Satisfaction to see, as dear Amelia appears to have been more free from Pain & Spasms than you wrote on the 22<sup>d</sup>, and to have received further Relief from the Obduracy. Doctor Bose will not be at Weymouth until Monday, & therefore your second embarkment for Journey until Tuesday. We have arranged that you shall sleep at General Gueth's, on that night, at Woodgate Lane on Wednesday, Windsor Thursday night, South Bridge on Friday night & reach Windsor on Saturday. You will proceed at once to the house that your Doctor subscribes & which I have ordered to be prepared for you & dear Amelia's Reception & when I trust she will find the Rooms perfectly warm and well aired. I am satisfied that this is the best arrangement which could have been made & that the Residence there will prove more quiet and, under all circumstances, more comfortable than it could have been in any other house. I am certain that I need not repeat that nothing shall be wanting on my part which can tend to her Satisfaction.
