Nothing but great distress of mind
 had caused my long silence
 my dear friends - also
 I have nothing good to say as
 the King's disorder continues
 as violent as ever & since
 last Sunday (this day week)
 he has refused all nourishment
 but one small piece of
 dry & cold water -
 the King's body strength still
 keeps up most wonderfully
 & is easily supported by the
 little sleep he gets - but it
 is out of the question it can
 last long in this state &
 no body who loves the King
 can see and wish his life to
 be prolonged any longer in the
 deplorable state he is in

is suffering much. — We hope
 we get the same as lately suffering
 as the the complaints of the
 Senior & expect to write
 to me very early — The Society
