My dear Mrs Adams

Many thanks for your  
 kind letter I rejoice you have  
 had all your former pleasures  
 with you as I ever will  
 understand what a pleasure  
 it would have been to all  
 of you. The account of our blind  
 King continues and  
 truly heart breaking the  
 mind full as much but  
 I am glad as ever and  
 on Sunday last a grand  
 and most wonderful of Providence  
 came on which is nothing  
 like our year, however  
 a sort of opinion which  
 but never to sleep for some

times valued him more  
 for a short time, yesterday  
 was rather a quarter along  
 therefore he is recruited for the  
 summer - but nothing can  
 be more deplorable than  
 his state & I fear here not  
 the recalled prospect  
 of his mind ever coming  
 round for it is not only  
 the old delirium but I am  
idea that he is surrounded  
 by most of his old friends  
 that have been dead at least  
 50 years - His takes up  
 much of his thoughts that  
 he has been time to ask  
 for any body in any one  
 thing else - He appears  
 quite happy with us having

which I daily write to the  
King are most interesting  
therefore the King is given  
off considerably to the  
extent of his health to
