My dear Mr Adams —

I rejoice you are able to send
me such good accounts of business
& I hope engaged that cold weather
will not cause any draw
back — As to myself I have seen
Dr Henry Heford and he says
with a little care I shall get
well soon — he wishes me to
be in town to be visited by him
so we shall settle for the
winter 10 days sooner than
was intended & go the 1st of
July — I am happy to say
I escaped all spasms yesterday

I feel much better, & hope to day I shall
 have I have done very well
 The Drafts & the new plan
 appears to agree - I go to
 Bedford tomorrow & I think
 with drawing quietly at
 home & look in my own
