My dear Sir

I did not delay submitting

 desire that they should be placed in the  
 Column at Brighton which had so long been  
 the Object of his late Majesty's particular  
 Attention. — He therefore requests You will  
 have the goodness to desire that they may  
 be sent to Brighton Column ascribed to  
 the Care of Miss Lovell the Housekeeper  
 should an Order from the Treasury be  
 required for the Release of the Vases.
