My dear Mr Adams,
I am quite ashamed of
not having thanked you
longer before now for your
last most kind & aff^r
letter which gave me
my great pleasure —
I hope I may say dear
Annie is not worse
at least she plays and
sings as ever before we
do not love you
& indeed in some
things I trust I may
do better than ever
any the last letter
is too much to be
out of sight — We continue

like the Play was very much
 & I am certain of my husband
 people can do less good
 they will - The storm is
 nearly quite healed which
 makes me have had
 one torment less - but
 the pain in the side
 is much the same
 this evening nearly
 gone without the attempt
 to move & then it
 comes on dreadfully
 she does get up for her
 dinner of an evening
 but does not attempt
 to walk from one
 room to the other -
 Gently she has
 dreadfully ill
 for some time long
 as much as is to alarm

all ten friends the same
 sort of attacks her
 Brother had only not
 as violent as they have
 kept them off long
 Hushing & cupping as
 well as Bleeding but
 she is much weaker
 My sisters want to see
 her when in some
 the other day & we
 stayed at her house -
 what a dreadful business
 this has been of some
 kind of distress it has
 been in all ways but
 thank God we thank
 my friends all his
 trials with his usual
 fortitude - I am sure
 I am quite well & do

and feel every respect
from the constant
and hearty concern of
myself and committee
of the policy I have
a request to be made
that papers will
be all the business
I have I have passed
for more than a
year from God bless
you I hope all your
family are quite
well believe me
