My dear Mr Adams I am quite glad
 you will begin to be uneasy at not
 hearing from me & when I tell you
 that besides being left to take care
 of my own children during the
 day & evening stay in I am
 your dear Sophia has been
 otherwise ill with the cold & has
 very bad spasms not able to
 move from the little things
 I have tried mostly on the
 right way giving from me
 with some to the other
 & attending myself as well
 as I could between these little
 children came to my house
 on Sunday & I with her
 but in the evening about
 7 o'clock I leave you to Sophia
 & not with her till 9 and
 in the morning give up
 to the little at 10 & not

returned to Amherst to tell
 me I hope I may say we do
 not love you and that
 she is all the better for
 leaving not all day in the
 garden at Langrune
 which we have since since
 Tuesday the weather
 quite delightful & that
 she has rather enjoyed it
 but the memory is very dear
 as we have much enjoyed
 dear books - the night has
 been very bad this last week
 the leaves on the side
 appear to me the chief
 complaint among the
 year's great losses in
 matters and some the
 the same - As to the

had not quite so attended
with a great deal of
inflammation. Had she
or several letters requiring
to stay - I think I need
not say how truly happy
your kind and kind
me - I can not help
writing you words for
an other week and
next summer. I hope
you & Maria soon get
wife to your journey
and a fine Maria
& all her children well
& your Mother much
recovered of not quite
returned to health -
Mrs Williams is still
with us as she has her
regard as to make with

arrangements to enable me
to stay in the way of the
private comfort of London
I have enjoyed the number
of requests more than
I can describe I have
been in the water
since being in the little
Chair a fortnight & more
went into the House
till 10 o'clock at night
God bless you kind love
to Maria & her's &
believe me
