N.B. It was settled that the above sum of £2400 should be repaid by Instalments of £300 a Year out of a Pension £600 p Annum granted by His Majesty to General Gardiner — and which Pension being assign'd to Thomas Coutts Esq: he engaged to reserve £75 p Quarter, from the Receipt of each Quarter of this Pension & to pay the sum so retained, when they amounted to £300 to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in part of the above advance, and to continue so doing 'till the whole should be discharged.
