Steward of our Household

These are to wile, & require you forthwith to swear, &
admit the Bearer hereof the said John Townsend into
into the place of Chief Gardiner of his Majesty's Royal
Gardens at Windsor in Ordinary according to the Contents
of his Majesty's Warrant. And for so doing this shall be your
