And for so doing This being first Enter'd with Our said Auditor-General shall be as well to You for Payment as to him for Allowance thereof on your Accounts a sufficient Warrant. Given at Leicester House the First Day of January 1742 In the Sixteenth Year of the Reign of Our Royal Father the King.
