I have ordered to be sown on St. John's day in June; it was to grow and produce plentifully supply of green Food all the Autumn, and next summer give a crop of Corn, which certainly the sample in the Garden fully answered, and when it came into Ear was stronger and taller than any Pyre I have ever seen.

Whether it be usefull in this Country what will be the inconvenience of its occupying Land for so long a period, whether the fodder gathered from it will repay the time are questions I cannot answer, the quantity of seed is one quart.
