

Sweden.

It is bounded on y^e N. by Norwegian Lapland, on y^e E. by Russia, On y^e S. by y^e Sk; & on y^e W. by Denmark & Norway.

It extends from y^e 56. Deg. of N. Lat. to y^e 69. & from y^e 10. to y^e 30. Deg. of Lon. reckoning from y^e Meridian of London, Finland is included which is now almost restor'd to y^e Swedes by y^e Russians.

y^e greatest Mountains are y^e Torne Hills which separate Sweden & Norway & are almost constantly cover'd with snow.

y^e Principal lakes, are, y^e Wenner & y^e Weter each near 100. miles in length, & y^e Meller on which Stockholm is built.

y^e Seas are y^e Sound which divides Gothland & Sconen, from Denmark, y^e Baltick between Sweden & Denmark, & y^e Gulf of Bothnia which divides Sweden & Livonia.

As to y^e Rivers they are not navigable because of y^e many Cataracts which obstruct their passage. Sweden is divided into Gothland, Sweden proper, Finland, & Swedish Lapland.

Gothland is subdivided into E. Gothland, W. Gothland, Wermeland, Dalia, Smaland, & Sconen.

Sweden Proper, is divided into Splan, where Stockholm is, Sudermavia, Senia, Westmania & Dalecarlia, y^e inhabitants of y^e latter are y^e fondest of Liberty, of any People under y^e Sun.

Finland, into E. Bothnia, Cajania, Finland proper, Plyland, Tavastia, Savolania, & Carelia.

Swedish Lapland into Geotica, Helvingia, Medelpedia, Jemhi, Hamerdall, Angermia, W. Bothnia

Sweden abounds in lakes, Marshes, Forests, Mountains, & Minerals. Land, y^e soil is fertile, abounds in Copper Iron & most of y^e commodities which are in Norway, with which they greatly trade.

Lapland is so barren y^t y^e Common people grind y^e white bark of y^e Fir tree, & make a sort of bread of it.

Sweden is bounded on *f. N.* by Norwegian Lapland; on *f. E.* by Russia; on *f. S.* by *f. Baltick* & on *f. W.* by Denmark & Norway.

It extends from *f. 56th* to *f. 69th* Deg. of *N. Lat.* & from *f. 10th* to *f. 30th* Deg. of long. but within these bounds is included Finland which was totally conquer'd by *f. Russians*, but since *f. last* peace betwixt these two Powers, *f. 50* of *f. Provinces* have been restor'd

There are a considerable ridge of Mountains, call'd *f. Dofring Hills*, to divide this *f. m.* from Norway, these are generally cover'd with snow; there are others in different parts, which make a disagreeable appearance, from whence numberless Rivers take their rise, but on account of *f. Rocks & Cataracts*, few of them are navigable; as to Lakes there are two, both of which are near 100. miles in length.

f. Seas of Sweden are *f. Solend*, which divide it from Denmark; *f. Baltick* or East Sea, which separates it both from Germany, & Livonia; & Bothnick Bay flows between it & Finland; & *f. Gulph* of Finland divides Livonia from Finland.

as to *f. Climate* it is much *f. same* as *f. of* Russia.

Sweden is divided into 6. grand Divisions 1. Gothland;
2. Old. Sweden; & Swedish Lapland; 4. Finland; ^{which now are reduc'd to *f. City* of Stralsund by *f. a* territory about it}
5. *f. Swedish* dominions in Germany; & 6. *f. Islands* of Sweden viz. those of Gothland, Oeland; Aland; Auen; Rugen; & Usedom; &c.
