 I staid till 12. then played upon the Harpsichord till  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after one, than Dress'd &  $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after two M<sup>r</sup> de  
 Luc came & read to me till 4. than we went to Dinner.  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  after five we went Upstairs & drank Caffe, & at six the  
 Princesses went to their Masters, by Holdernes to Her room  
 & I played with M<sup>r</sup> Horn upon the Harpsichord till  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after seven when the  $\text{V}^{\text{e}}$  arriv'd, the Music  
 begun immediately, the Younger Princesses, L<sup>dy</sup> Courtown &  
 Miss Townsend came at 8. We drank Tea, & the  $\text{V}^{\text{e}}$  played  
 with Monsieur de Dudo. & I played with <sup>three</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Holdernes,  
 Courtown & C. Finch. The Princesses Wok'd. we parted at  
 10. Supped & retired at 11. L<sup>dy</sup> Courtown & Miss Townsend staid  
 supper. To Day the  $\text{V}^{\text{e}}$  gave Audience to the



Duke of Orleans, who is not come in a public Capacity but  
brought only a Private Letter from the French King.  
Very Fine all Day.

Windsor Thursday the 29<sup>th</sup> of October 1759. After early  
Prayers we Breakfasted,  $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after the Princesses Walked  
& at 10. The King went out. I staid with Lord Holderness  
till 11. He went out a Walking & I into my room, saw  
Monsieur Best the Kings German Secretary, & Miss Meas the  
Paintress, wrote several Letters & went an airing at 12. with  
Lord Holderness & Court town, returned by 4. Dressed &  
His Majesty staid with me dancing whilst my Hair was dress'd  
~~at~~ at 3. Mr de Lau came & read to me till 4. when we went  
to Dinner. staid with the King till 6. then went up stairs, the Prin-  
cesses to their Masters & I play'd upon the Harpsichord till  $\frac{1}{2}$  an  
Hour after 4. when the King came. The Music began at 8 the 3 You-  
nger Princesses & Lord Court town & Miss Townsend came. we Drank Tea, &

played at Cards as the Night before. We parted at 10. Supp  
Lady Courtown & Miss Townsend staying Supper & we retired  
at 11. — Very fine all Day.

Windsor Fryday the 30<sup>th</sup> Octbr/ 1789. After early  
Prayers we Breakfasted. The King sent for M<sup>r</sup> de Luc  
whom He made read an <sup>Letter</sup> ~~address or message~~ from the  
French King & His Ministers to the Tiers Etat. at 10  
we all went to our rooms. The King did not go out this Mor-  
ning. I played upon the Harpsichord from 1/2 after 11. till one  
then Dress'd. & at two M<sup>r</sup> de Luc came & read to me till 4.  
then we Dined & staid with the King till 6. then went  
Upstairs as Usual. 1/2 Hour after 7. the King came & Music  
began. at 8 the Younger Princesses ~~came~~ Lady Courtown &  
Miss Townsend came we drank Tea & played at Cards as the  
Night before. We parted at 10. Supp'd & retired at 11. Lady Courtown  
& Miss Townsend staid Supper. Very fine all Day.



Windsor Saturday the 31<sup>st</sup> Octbr. 1789. After early Prayers  
we Break fasted, ~~but~~ after which M<sup>r</sup> Wis & the Painters brought  
a Drawing of the S<sup>t</sup> Pauls done by a M<sup>r</sup> Day, for a M<sup>r</sup> Every  
a Printseller, which is to be engraved, & at 10. The Q<sup>d</sup> went  
out a Hunting & we went into our rooms. The Q<sup>d</sup> receiving  
this Morning an account of a Rebellion having begun at in  
Flanders & of their <sup>having</sup> seized the Chancellor Purnpion &  
carried Him off & plundered His House, but that the Troops  
having begun to act there was hopes of putting soon an End to  
those Troubles. & that even there they suspected the Duke of  
Orleans to be the cause of their Troubles. ~~Went on~~ at 12  
I play'd upon the Harpsichord & a little after one P. Poyes  
Augusta & M<sup>r</sup> Stodernes & myself took an airing, were  
turn'd by two, I dress'd & at 3 saw de Lue who read to me till  
4. then we dined & laid with the K<sup>g</sup> till 6. went Upstairs  
& read till  $\frac{1}{4}$  after 9. When the K<sup>g</sup> came & Music began,



at 8 the Younger Princesses came to my Court town. Miss  
 Townsend <sup>was</sup> confined with a Cold we drank Tea, &  
 playd at Cards, with mys Mr Deneys, Court town, & P.  
 Augusta. & The Y<sup>rs</sup>. & J<sup>rs</sup>. Budei. we parted at 10. Supped  
 & retired at 11. My Court town staid Supper.

This day the Y<sup>rs</sup> went for the last time this Year to  
 early Prayers.

We received an account of Mr Ansons Death, He was  
 member for Litchfield in Staffords hire, Nephew &  
 Heir to the late Lord Anson, Brother in Law to  
 Lord Vernon whose own Sister He married by whom He  
 has left 11 Children. 8 Sons & 3 Daughters the Eldest  
 of which is married to a Mr Ford of Barbados.

Very Fine Dry Weather all day.

Windsor Sunday the 15<sup>th</sup> of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1759. We  
 break fasted by 9.  $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after I went Ups stairs song



a German Sermon to the 3 Elder Princesses, a little after  
we went to the Chapel the Rev<sup>d</sup> Mr Lockman preached, the  
one of the Prebends of Windsor, Clerk of the Closet to the  
Prince of Wales, & has the living of St Crofs at in Hamp-  
shire. we came from Church  $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after 12. & saw  
Lord Winchelsea one of the Kings Lords of the Bedchamber  
only Son to Lady Charlotte Finch, Mrs & Miss Fielding,  
Mr Manwaring, & the Bishop of Exeter. His Majesty  
& the two Gentlemen Lord Bude & Major Garth, Myself  
they Princesses Com<sup>rs</sup> Holderness & Courtown, & Lord Stappford  
went a Walking to Frogmore where we met Lord Deaulieu &  
Mrs Ann Edgerton. we returned at two then dress'd & read  
from 3 till 4. when the 3 Younger Princesses came we  
dined & laid with the King till 6. then went Up Stairs  
the Younger Princesses to Mansell Monument, & I read an  
English Sermon to P. George & Augusta, Princess Elizabeth & King

with Madame de la Fite.  $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after 9. The Play came  
& Music began. at 8. By Courtown & Miss Townsend  
and by ~~Effingham~~ Chesterfield, & Lady Effingham & Sr

after 10. Supped & retired at 11. By Courtown & Miss

4. The Duke of York came & dined with us we staid  
with the King till 4. then went Up Stairs the Music  
began immediately. at 8. the Younger Princesses came we

Duke of York & Duke Holderness & Courtown & myself, & the

We breakfasted at 9. &  $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour past we set out from ~~London~~ Windsor accompanied by the 3 Eldest Princesses & 3 H<sup>o</sup> D<sup>o</sup> Vernefs & arrived ~~in London~~ at the Q<sup>u</sup> House by 12. in the Dining room we found Stunne<sup>r</sup> the Painter with a Picture of the Q<sup>u</sup> in His Robes for the Town Hall of Worcester. I went up Stairs into my rooms & found Miss Goldsworthy there. about  $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after 12. the Q<sup>u</sup> went to St James to the Levie. I went to Dress at  $\frac{1}{2}$  Hour after one, the D<sup>o</sup> of York <sup>came &</sup> staid whilst I dress'd my Hair. He told me that St James Sinclore was married this morning to a Miss Doueris. He left me at Little after two & at 3.
