a feverish Complaint during yesterday's debate, I am anxious to  
hear how you bore the fatigue of the last night; I find Lt. Col.  
D'Auvergne of the first Troop of Horse Guards is dead, as  
Lt. Col. Burgoyne could succeed to this without any expense,  
and as the being attached to a Corps <sup>in London</sup> may perhaps be agreeable  
to him I shall not fill up the Vacancy until I know  
whether it might not suit him.
