Lord North, It is with pleasure I learn that the Address pass'd this day without a Division, that a Committee of the whole House is appointed to examine into the high price of the Corn, and a Secret Committee into the present situation of the East India Company. I cannot omit reminding You that though I trust when the Company finds the Committee has laid the true state before the House, that it cannot avoid coming into such an agreement as may be thought secure for its Creditors, and equitable for the Public and the Proprietors, but that if this should not happen that You will be prepared with a plan for conducting those affairs, if You form it Yourself it will be just, and there are men of ability in Parliament will certainly support it well in the House; but if You are open to their ideas nothing will be done for everyone will have schemes incompatible with those of the others You may consider
