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I now transmit to Lord North an exact List of the Persons I have on mature and anxious deliberation thought fit to place about my eldest Son, I had the satisfaction yesterday to find him thoroughly satisfied ^{on my giving} ~~with~~ ^{the} arrangement as he felt that his good and no other motive dictated my choice; I have in one instance departed from the line I originally had laid down to myself by appointing one Young Man as his Groom of the Bedchamber that is the second son of Lord Dartmouth, but the great and known piety of the Father and his having said he would answer for the sagacity of his Son made me think it wiser to fix on him than to be looking out for one other who might not in every particular answer so well.

Lord North will have the Warrant made out for the Establishment as in my case the Gentleman will not have any Warrants as it would vacate their Seats in Parliament; Lieut. Col. Gotham is also to receive the Money for paying the Establishments of My Sons William and Edward which amounts will be transmitted by him in the same manner to the Treasury as they were by the Duke of Montagu, he will also receive for the new Establishment of the three Upper Boys who I shall know in a few days taken out of the hands of the Women as also £15,000. as I promised him the last time I saw him, that Faill promiseth
to resign on Friday when the D. of Montague will accept of his
Office, the day he is to bring P. of Wales new Gentleman the
presente, that they may be able to appear with My Son on
New Years Day; the Queen will also that day appoint
Lord Hylobury Her Chamberlain; I hope when Lord North
comes to St. James's tomorrow he will be ath to suggest some
proper person to me to be recommended to the Queen as
Her Vice Chamberlain, as also one for Secretary being
now certain that Dr. Harris is dead.

It will be necessary that Lieut. Col. Notham shoudt
have some money in hand to satisfy the travelling
expenses of my son Frederick to Hanover who goes on
Saturday, as also for the purchase of the additional
Coach and saddle horses of Prince of Wales and giving
him some privy purse money, I shoudt therefore propose
Lord North shoudt order a sum of £ 2000. to be paid to
Lieut. Col. Notham for the immediat wants; the D. of
Montague will make up his Recounts to the 5th January
and the new Establishments ought to bear date from that
period.
