your Majesty. - But he is rather
apprehensive that feeling Altogether
to see the Prince, might be subject to
Mis construction; and It does not strike

him that there could be any material
inconvenience, if it were intimated
(as graciously as circumstances will
admit) that His Royal Highness has
absented himself only by his own choice
and that your Majesty and the Queen
will at any time be ready to receive
him; especially as it seems perfectly

natural to decline any communication
on the subject of ^{His} Royal Highness's
situation, unless there should occur any
thing to induce your Majesty to think it
desirable. - Mr Pitt feels at the same ^{Time}
that this point is one not easy to judge of,
and can only submit to your Majesty
with great diffidence. The Dear what
