Windsor May 19<sup>th</sup> 1795

I should not have written these lines to Mr. Pitt had  
not I been spoken to at the Ball at Grosvenor the last  
Evening both by the Prince and Princess of Wales on the  
Report made to the former by the Earl of Cholmondeley  
of his Conference yesterday in Downing Street. I very  
clearly explained that there must be some mistake  
for that after the Plan set forth to be adopted with  
regard to ~~settling~~ <sup>arranging</sup> the Prince's Affairs had originated  
entirely from Mr. Pitt it was impossible for me to  
honorably sit so late a period on track and be  
for yielding to the insidious <sup>and demagogical</sup> proposition of  
Mr. Fox, that Government is first engaged in the  
question, and that no one that has any attachment  
to Royalty, as well as those attached to my Family  
can be <sup>in any manner</sup> for admitting any Proposal either of the  
Crown or the King's Affair, that my younger  
sons acted very handsomely in not having objected  
to the Duke of Cornwall being with were  
most engaged for a time but a total alienation of the  
Revenue of that Duke must and certainly would be the  
consequence
